Towards a sustainable and greener research...!!!

Health and ecosystems face serious due uncontrolled threats to emissions of greenhouse gases, pollution and hazardous waste. Though industries and automobiles are the major sources, the role of healthcare research cannot be ignored. Research projects seldom have any direct influence on the environment, but the results may

environmental improvement or damage. contribute to Carbon foot print is an estimate of green house gas emission caused directly or indirectly by an individual, event, organization or product expressed as carbon dioxide equivalent (CO2e). Though looks trivial, it is pertinent to look in to the carbon foot print by medical research team and take necessary steps to minimize it. The National Institute of Health Research (NIHR), UK has already introduced guidelines for carbon reduction in clinical trials. A study is under progress at the Department of Orthodontics, GDC Kottayam in collaboration with the School of Environmental Sciences, MG University, Kottayam to investigate the environmental impact of Clear Aligner orthodontic material. Clear Aligners, a newer orthodontic treatment modality uses a series of plastic trays to sequentially move teeth to ideal positions. Each set of trays are used for a period of about 2 weeks and then discarded. For the entire course of treatment the number of trays can vary from 50 to 100 per case. The disposal of these used trays and stereolithographic models is becoming a problem; hence its environmental impact is currently being studied.

It was heartening to note that the University of Kerala had issued notice and conducted the Ph.D. open defence following the green protocol based on UGC guidelines. It is the responsibility of every researcher to adopt sustainable green research protocols to reduce environmental pollution. The Institution Ethics Committee should mandatorily perform an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for each research protocol to ensure entire research related activity and its outcome is environmentally sustainable.

The highlights of the conference were the meticulous arrangements, the quality and diversity of scientific content, exceptional conferencing facilities, sustainability initiatives and nature-friendly measures adopted for its smooth conduct. Attending international scientific conferences of the calibre of EuroPerio would undoubtedly broaden the horizons of young professionals and prepare them to demonstrate their talent to a global audience.

Such meetings will help to uplift our professional standards to par with the international level. The added advantage of EuroPerio was that I got my two papers published in the supplementary edition of the high-impact journal, Journal of Clinical Periodontology, as poster abstracts. Tell us about your research activities.

I am doing a multidisciplinary research project on Lichen Planus under the supervision of Dr Karolin Hijazi, Dr Rasha Abu Eid, and Professor Maggie Cruickshank at University of Aberdeen. The project investigate factors that influence the response to topical steroid treatment in lichen planus patients.

I have developed my skills in systematic review designing, digital pathology imaging, and laboratory techniques. Additionally, I have been fortunate to get involved in another project focused on oral cancer and dysplasia patients. Currently, I am engaged in drafting the manuscript for the systematic review on severity scoring systems in mucosal lichen planus. I am independently managing patient recruitment and research sessions for the study.

What advice do you have for interns and residents?

If you have a strong research interest, make use of every opportunity that helps you understand research, even if it's a quick read of a simple research paper. For example, journal clubs (critically evaluating the research papers) organized in the postgraduate curriculum help to develop critical appraisal skills. In addition, seek good opportunities (learning a laboratory technique) and try to work under experienced research scholars.

Tell us about your experience in research and publications in PG life.

My personal experience with research was hampered in the first year due to lack of adequate time. The second year provided me with a conducive environment to plan my research, coupled with ideas and concepts from my mentors and staff members of Govt Dental College Kottayam. Even though my first few publications were rejected, discussions with seniors and friends who had previous experience with research and publications helped me immensely. An unavoidable requirement for success is a good research team that works for quality with selflessness.

What advice do you have for interns and residents?

Research in PG life mostly starts with identifying the thesis topic. Do spend adequate time on understanding the basics of research methodology. Start reading and getting involved in simple studies such as case series. To begin, commence the groundwork with those who have adequate resources and always surround yourself with those who help in increasing the caliber. Publishing in reputed, indexed journals is an achievable task provided the research team works in unison. Do make use of departmental journal clubs, research activities, and identify the grey areas in literature. Adequate resources and workshops are available within the institution and online to gain experience. I wish you the very best. Happy researching!
